

Do You Have Questions About the VOTE411.org/Nebraska General Election Voters' Guide?

LWVNE gathers candidate addresses from county clerks or election officials in all 93 counties (note that some candidate addresses are not available). Candidates in contested races were sent postcards requesting that they opt into the VOTE411.org service as free publicity for their campaign and as an opportunity to inform their electorate. As of Oct. 1, approximately 211 races had candidates and 339 candidates had opted in to participate. Of those 339 candidates, 55% have responded thus far.

There are two ways to find candidate information – in the Voters' Guide on our website or by using the VOTE411.org portal. To receive their ballot and other personalized information, a voter simply clicks on the "Find What's on Your Ballot" icon on the VOTE411.org site to type in their address. Candidates who have responded to the LWVNE's invitation to participate will be displayed, and their responses to questions can be compared side-by-side for each city, county, district, state and federal race on the voter's general election ballot. League volunteers created the questions for candidates on important issues relevant to Nebraska voters.

VOTE411.org and the Voters' Guide may not mirror a voter's ballot exactly. Only candidates in contested races were contacted to participate. In addition, only races where candidates chose to opt into participating will be displayed. Finally, candidates in a specific county are listed together, so you may find races on your personalized VOTE411.org that are not on your actual ballot.
